ARTICLE 1

To elect a Moderator to preside at said meeting. **DAVE MORRISON WAS ELECTED MODERATOR**

ARTICLE 2 PASSED YES-131 NO-34

Shall the Town vote to authorize the Town Manager to execute a Performance Contracting Agreement with Siemens Industry, Inc. with certain Performance Guarantees described therein, to upgrade multiple public buildings, increase energy efficiency, and reduce long term energy demands and costs?

Note: The proposed Performance Contracting Agreement, with Exhibits A through D-1, is available for inspection in the Clerk's office; the Agreement and the Town Manager's Summary may be read here and will be part of permanent record in Town Clerk's files.

ARTICLE 3 PASSED WITH A MAJORITY VOTE

In the event that Article 2 is approved by the voters, shall the Town vote to authorize the Town Manager to execute a Financing Agreement/Loan with Siemens Industry, Inc. in the total amount of \$2,336,000, as amortized over a 17 year-period and with an annual interest rate not to exceed 2.5 %, to fund the energy efficiency Work and improvements described in the Performance Contracting Agreement?

Note: The total Loan amount of \$2,336,000 will be reduced by any sums authorized to be drawn and paid from the Unassigned Fund Balance as described in Article 4.

ARTICLE 4 PASSED WITH A MAJORITY VOTE

Shall the Town vote to fund the up-front initial costs of the Performance Contracting Agreement by drawing and paying to Siemens Industry, Inc., at the appropriate time, up to the sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) from the Unassigned Fund Balance, also known as the Camden Reserve Fund?

ARTICLE 5 PASSED YES-104 NO-2
